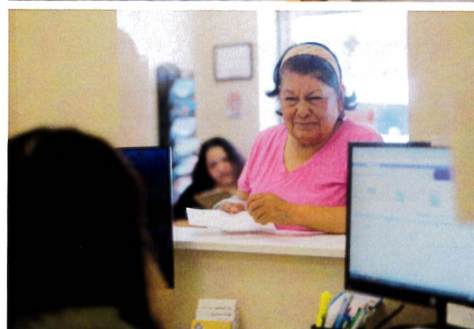




Our mission is to share the love of Christ by partnering with our community to provide quality, comprehensive, and compassionate health care to our medically underserved neighbors.

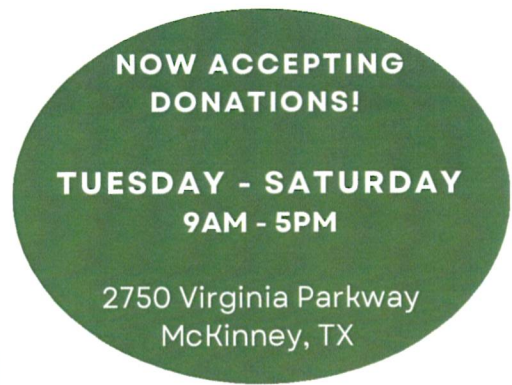

- ✓ Must be a high school graduate and at least 18 years old.
- ✓ Application and background check
References and photo ID
Immunizations and TB test
License/certification documentation
- ✓ Read and sign volunteer handbook and confidentiality statement
- ✓ 2 shadow shifts with a seasoned volunteer
- ✓ 6 month commitment, at least 2 shifts a month

- ✓ **Clinical Tech** - Clean and prepare exam rooms, collect medical histories, process urine samples and take vitals.

Pergola, Pantry, Ground Improvement - Project Scope (Building it)

Project Scope

- Establish a new McKinney Little Free Pantry location.
- Construct a 10' × 10' pergola to provide a covered, weather-protected area.
- Purchase or construct a new pantry designed for durability, accessibility, and community use.
- Prepare and improve the ground surface to provide a safe, stable, and accessible approach.
- Install the pergola and pantry at the new location.
- Complete necessary finishing and site improvements to create a welcoming, functional space for the community.

Pergola	Estimated Cost	\$2,500–\$2,750
Buy cabinet (resale store)	Estimated Cost	\$250-\$300
Build cabinet	Estimated Cost	\$2,100 - \$2,500
Ground Improvement	Estimated Cost	\$500-\$600

Total Estimated Cost \$5,500-\$6,100





Pantry Pergola Improvement Project

Objective: Improve the walkway beneath the existing pergola to create a safe, attractive, and accessible entrance to the McKinney Little Free Pantry by eliminating mud, standing water, and loose gravel.

Project Scope

- Install 54 feet of metal edging approximately 6 inches inside the pergola posts
- Fill the area with 2 inches of decomposed granite and grade with a slight west-to-east slope for drainage.
- Install fifteen 12-inch pavers in front of the pantry and tamp securely into place
- Remove approximately 18 inches of crushed granite at the curb and replace with decomposed granite.
- Reuse existing pavers behind the pantry to create a border that helps prevent gravel from washing into the driveway.

Tools Needed:

Wheelbarrows, rakes, shovels, and soil tampers (provided by Trinity Presbyterian Church volunteers if needed).

Estimated Materials & Cost

- Metal edging (54 ft.).....\$167.86
- Decomposed granite.....\$71.00
- 15 Concrete pavers.....\$28.05
- Delivery (estimated).....\$200.00

Total Estimated Cost: \$466.91

Webb Elementary

- **Fulfill a specific classroom need**

Ways to Serve
